Gray Whale Grid

ACTIVITY: Plotting coordinates to make a gray whale graph.

Grade Level(s): 3-8th



Varies (30 to 60 minutes)

Overview: Students plot coordinates to create a gray whale.

DISCIPLINES: Science, math

OBJECTIVES: Students will be able to:

- Construct a graph using supplied coordinates
- Create their own graph by determining coordinates that create the outline of a gray whale
- Assess and adjust coordinates to create gray whale calf outline.

MATERIALS:

- Pencils, erasers
- Photo copies of Gray Whale Grid activity sheet OR grid paper
- Ruler or strips of paper to help students line up coordinates.

WHAT TO DO:

1. Have students plot the coordinates below.

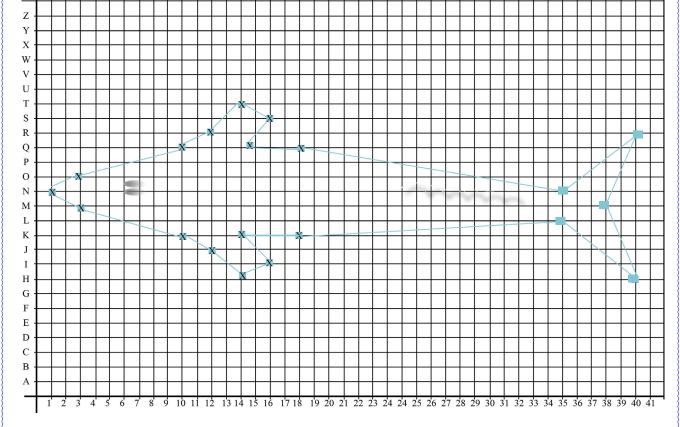

2. Have students connect the plot points in the order they plotted them.

3. Students can color in their gray whale.



Go Deeper:

- 1. On grid paper, have students create a spyhopping gray whale (A vertical whale with head out of water--see photo to right). Have them draw the basic outline. Then have them mark coordinates with an "X." Have students write the coordinates on a separate piece of paper.
- 2. To assess and adjust the coordinates, have students either plot the coordinates they've noted on a new sheet of grid paper. Or, have them share/trade their coordinates with another student and have that student plot the coordinates to create the spyhopping whale.

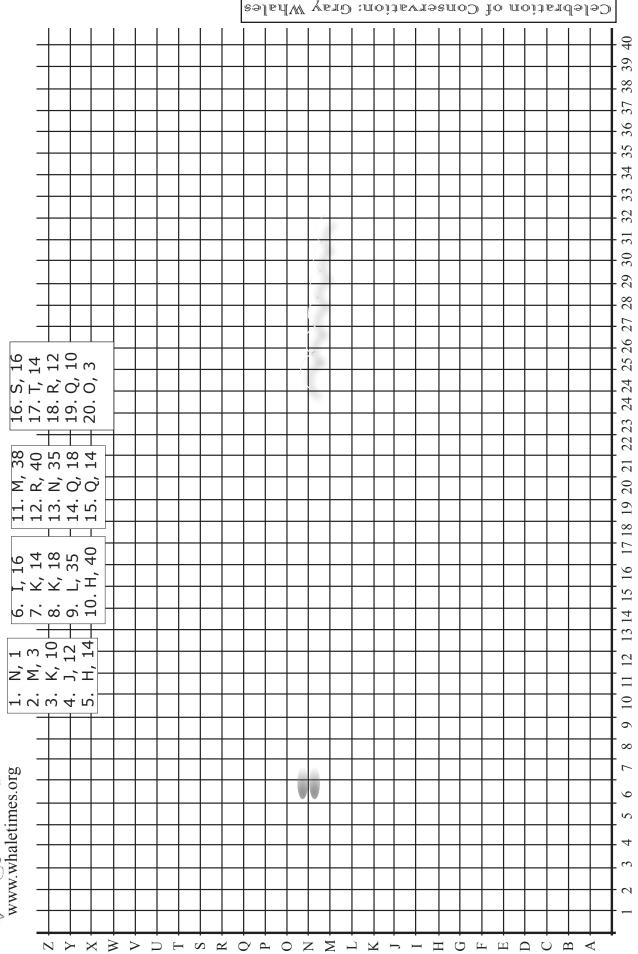
