WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO CELEBRATE ELEPHANT SEALS?

Elephant seals are one of the true conservation success stories. In 1900, maybe 25 or so elephant seals were left on Guadalupe Island Mexico. Complete protection of this species combined with its unusual breeding behavior and it's ability to feed widely over the ocean has enabled them to recover to over 175,000 individuals today.
