ACTIVITY: Become a scientist and track tagged seals







DISCIPLINES: Science, language arts OBJECTIVES: Students will be able to:

- Create an elephant seal life history tag
- Discuss why scientists tag and track elephant seals

- MATERIALS: card stock
 - child-safe markers
 - yarn
 - pencils or pens
 - crayons
 - hole punch
 - photocopies: Elephant Seal Tag Sighting Form and
 - Elephant Seal Tag pattern (k-2nd or 3-6th)
 - Photo of elephant seal tag

NOTE: Depending on students' age and time allowed, you might choose to create the tag and complete the form, or only do one of the activities

Preparation:

- **Step 1**: Photocopy *Elephant Seal Tag Sighting Form* (one per student)
- Step 2: Select the *Elephant Seal Tag* that will work for your students. Then print or photocopy one per student onto card stock. Cut out.
- **Step 3**: For younger students, pre-punch the hole punch at the top of the tag.
- Step 4: Pre-cut yarn (one per student). For younger students, you might choose to pre-tie the yarn onto the tags.
- Step 5: Print a photo of an elephant seal tag and *various photos of elephant seals on the beach (see Celebration of Conservation activity page) or prepare to project on classroom screen.

WHAT TO DO:

- **Step 1**: Show students the photo of the tag on an elephant seal. Read Dr. Patrick Robinson's Seamail and discuss the purpose of the tag and how scientists track the seal throughout the years.
- Step 2: Tell them, as part of Team Elephant Seal, they'll each create a tag for one of the seals and track its history for the year.
- Step 3: Have students decide their seal's four-digit ID number. Have them write it as big as they can on the back side of the tag (the side without writing).
- Step 4: Complete the tag form together. NOTE: Students do not need to fill in every date. The tag/form could be for the day the seal was tagged. You can discuss how scientists would fill in the form throughout the year and subsequent years. Have students draw their seal.
- OPTIONAL: Create a classroom log of seal sightings. Put the tags in a pile and have kids randomly select a seal. Pick a date some time between December to August. The student tracking that seal can add the sighting to their form.
